Pupils will be provided with money for lunch at Southwold on Friday (included within the cost of the trip), but will then be preparing food at the accommodation for dinner, breakfast and packed lunch on Saturday (all ingredients brought with us from Tesco but included within the price of the trip). We anticipate return to The John Warner School at approximately 17:00 on Saturday.

**Itinerary:**

Day One – Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> March

- Meet in The John Warner School canteen (by the reception entrance) for no later than 08:15
- Depart by 08:30
- Arrive in Southwold at approximately 10:30 – Welcome in classroom, toilets, refreshments 10:30-11:15
- Walking tour of Southwold town and beach

- Classroom session introducing NEA - Introduction to NEA - Aims and hypotheses – what is and is not appropriate and realistic - Scale and feasibility of successful NEAs - Consideration of example ideas of local issues to investigate
- 12:30-13:30 – in Southwold for lunch which is to be provided by the students
- 13:30-16:30 - Fieldwork menu (human focus) – students will be introduced to what we can measure and then have an opportunity to practice these techniques with support in the proximity of the centre. Followed up with ideas of how to present and use each method
- Depart for accommodation at approximately 16:30–17:00 for dinner and down time

#### Day Two – Saturday, 17th March

- Students to prepare own breakfast and make own lunch for the day
- 10:00–14:30 - Fieldwork menu (physical focus) based on either human or physical focus – students will be introduced to what we can measure and then have an opportunity to practice these techniques on the town's beach which will be followed up with ideas of how to present and use each method
- 12:30–13:30 – in Southwold for lunch which is to be provided by the students
- 13:30-15:00 – Preparing NEA – ideas for planning a successful study – to be prepared for return visit including advice on literature review, methodologies, sampling, risk assessments etc.
- Depart at 15:00 approximately
- Estimated arrival time back at The John Warner School approximately 17:00
